

P	The tragic end of Oedipus is so pitiful and fearful that we leave the theater as if our emotions have been swept away by a tide. This is called the (a-Purgation / b-Clarification/ c-Purification) theory of catharsis.
<u>u</u> :	Another major philosopher of his period was Plotinus. He transformed Plato's philosophy into a school called (a-Neoplatonism/ b-Neoclassicism / c-Structuralism). His <i>Enneads</i> had a wideranging influence on European thought until at least the seventeenth century.
